

Internet Explorer 7 and Viewing Protected Galleries

Microsoft's I.E. 7.0 comes with much tighter security than earlier versions of Internet Explorer. Individuals who download and install I.E. 7.0 will not be able to access the Protected Page without making an adjustment to the Security settings of their browser.

A warning bar does appear alerting the user that the webpage is trying to open a scripted page. The option to temporarily allow the opening of scripted pages probably will not work despite the information Microsoft provides in their Help file. A copy of the Help section is shown in the table. The only option our limited testing shows is to allow websites to prompt for the information (highlighted). The screen shots below show what you need to be change in order for the Protected Gallery Pages to work with I.E. 7.0. Go to the Menu Bar and select Tools, Internet Options, and then select the Security Tab to see the window below.

To always allow scripted windows, check the Allow websites to prompt for information using scripted windows custom security setting.</p>
